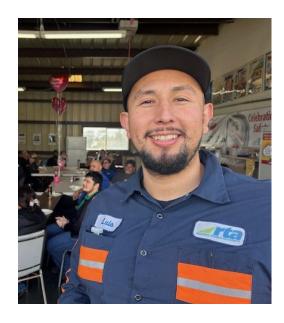

Morro Bay Transit & Atascadero DAR Consolidation into the RTA

- Morro Bay Transit agreement fully executed
 - Transition by June 1
- Atascadero City Council executed agreement on February 25;
 SLOCOG on April 2nd
 - Transition by June 22



Bus Operator Recruitment

- Bus Operator Erin in training
- Six candidates in background checks
- Three open Bus Operator bids



Maintenance & Facilities

- Bus Maintenance Facility improvement projects:
 - Phase 2 Electric Vehicle Servicing Equipment (\$960k)
 - Photovoltaic Panels & Energy Storage System (1.36M)
 - Interviews on Friday
 - Will bring price proposals to May 5th Board meeting
- Working with CEC staff to secure \$1.7M grant for five inground contactless inductive chargers:
 - Funding matched with SB125 funding
 - Fully funds opportunity charging at four layover sites



Marketing & Communications

- Developing all new Morro Bay Transit rider communications materials
- Working on designs for new BEB decals package
- Info booths at Cuesta and Allan Hancock College campuses
- Company newsletter
- Cal-ITP Contactless Fare-Capping System update



Finance & Administration

- Submitted grant applications for the four BEBs authorized at the January 2025 Board meeting
- The FTA has awarded Section 5307 grant, but still awaiting discretionary Section 5339 determination



FY24-25 Performance Results

- RTA Intercity fixed-route up 6.7% over last year
- Paso Robles fixed-routes up 25.2%
- South County fixed-routes down 5.5%
- Runabout up 7.0%

FY24-25 Financial Results

- Farebox Recovery Ratio results:
 - RTA Intercity Fixed-Route 8.7%
 - Paso Robles 16.7%
 - South County 5.2%
 - Runabout 3.1%
- Subsidy per passenger results:
 - RTA Intercity Fixed-Route \$14.61
 - Paso Robles \$4.77
 - South County \$11.63
 - Runabout \$135.30
 - After factoring in nearly 8,000 fixed-route trips \$92.39

BEB Background

- Began planning for zero-emission buses in 2017
- Ordered first two BEBs from GILLIG in May 2022
 - \$1,040,660/each
 - Largest battery capacity available(686kWh)
- Delivered March 2024
- Placed into revenue service in July 2024

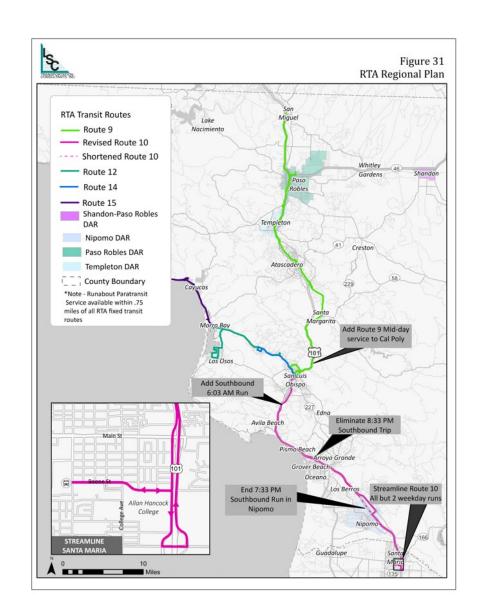
Plan Overview

- An increasing amount of LTF will be required, even for base case
- Both financially constrained and financially unconstrained plan elements identified.
- Operating costs will increase by \$106,000 in FY 25-26, then \$50,000 annually thereafter.
- Ridership will increase by 1 percent over status quo
- Maintains a safe an operable fleet which address ZEV requirements
- Identifies need for new/improved transfer points
- Implements new fare technologies and simplifies fare structure



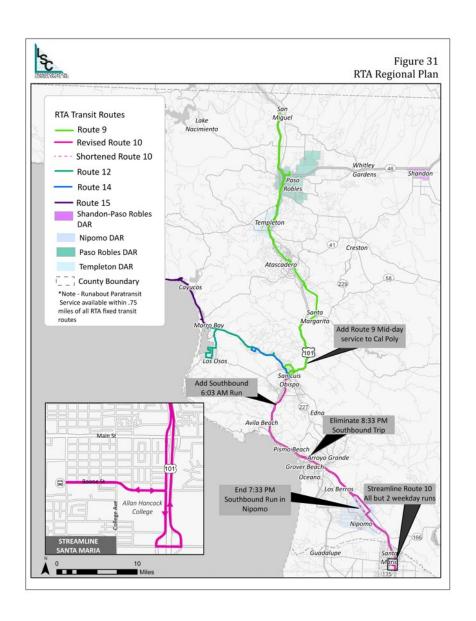
RTA Regional Route Service Plan Elements

- ☐ Streamline Route 10 in Santa Maria All but 2 weekday runs
 - Addresses termination of pass-through FTA funding from SMRT
 - Ridership loss of 1,700 one-way passengertrips annually
 - Reduces annual operating costs by \$27,000
- ☐ End 7:33 PM Run at Nipomo and Eliminate Route 10 8:33 PM Southbound Trip
 - Addresses termination of pass-through FTA funding from SMRT
 - Eliminates low ridership Route 10 run
 - Ridership loss of 5,100 trips annually
 - Reduces annual operating costs by \$84,000



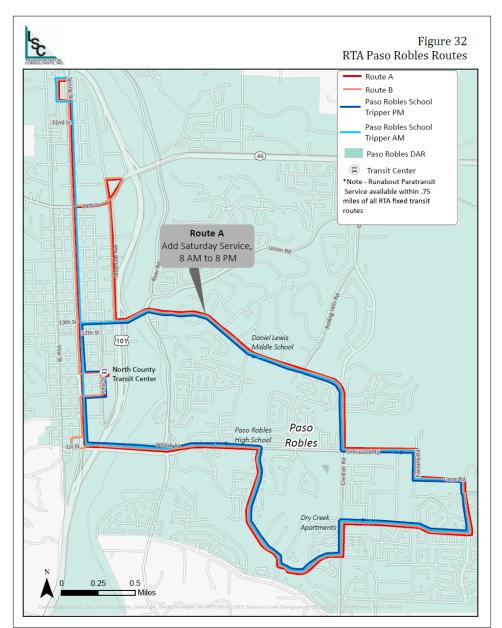
RTA Regional Route Service Plan Elements

- ☐ Provide Route 10 Southbound 6:03 AM Run
 - Provides more options for SLO commuters to Santa Maria
 - Increases ridership by 3,600 trips annually
 - Increases operating costs by \$19,700
- ☐ Add Route 9 Mid-Day Service to Cal Poly
 - Increases direct service to Cal Poly from North County
 - Increases ridership by 400 trips annually
 - Increases annual operating costs by \$1,700



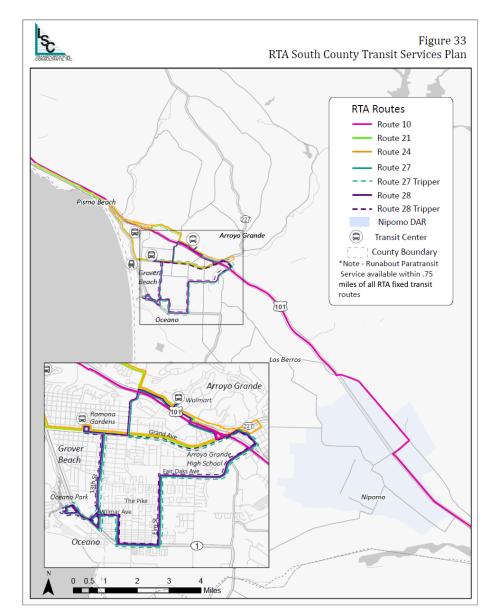
RTA North County Service Plan Elements

- ☐ Add Paso Robles High School and Daniel Lewis Middle School Tripper
 - Adresses increase in student ridership and suspension of yellow bus service
 - Increases ridership by 1,100 trips annually
 - Increases annual operating costs by \$19,700
- ☐ Add Saturday Route A Service, 7:45 AM to 6 PM
 - Ridership has been growing in Paso Robles
 - Only Route B operates on Saturdays currently
 - Increases ridership by 4,400 trips
 - Increases annual operating costs by \$39,700



RTA South County Service Plan Elements

- ☐ Reinstate Arroyo Grande High School Tripper
 - Adresses student ridership growth trends
 - Increases ridership by 1,100 trips annually
 - Increases annual operating costs by \$26,100



RTA Financially Unconstrained Elements

- Add Paso Robles Route B Sunday Service, 8:30 AM to 5:30 PM
- ☐ Add 1 RT on Routes 9 and 10 on Saturdays
- ☐ Add Saturday Service on Route 27, 7:30 AM to 8:15 PM

RTA Fare Structure Recommendations

- ☐ Implement Cal-ITP Open-Loop Contactless Payment/Fare-Capping System
- □ \$2 for 1 Hour fare structure to replace current zone fares on Regional Routes
 - Makes fare payment easier and convenient for passengers, therefore encourages ridership
 - Promotes "fare fairness"
 - Potential to phase out GenFare fareboxes
- ☐ Discount Fare Verification Process
 - Staff costs of \$50 100K
 - Cal-ITP benefits



RTA Capital Plan

- ☐ On-going fleet replacement include ZEB purchases
- Expansion of the current fleet not required as part of the service plan
- ☐ ZEB charging infrastructure
- ☐ Bus stop improvements
- Future South County Transfer Point
- ☐ Relocate Government Center Transfer Point

- The Atascadero City Council authorized consolidation on February 25th
- Would take effect on June 22nd.
- Begin interviewing MV's Bus Operators later this month, and train in April

 - SLO BMF
- Projects qualify for Class 1 Existing Facility
 Modification exemption under CEQA



- Accept the Notice of Exemption for the Inductive Charging Stations Project,
- Direct the Executive Director to file the Notice of Exemption with the San Luis Obispo Clerk to the Board of Supervisors, and
- 3. Direct to Executive Director to proceed with project development.
